Enagás signs an agreement to raise its stake in Transportadora de Gas del Perú, S.A. (TgP) from 24.34% to 25.98%

Enagás has reached an agreement to acquire 1.64% of Transportadora de Gas del Perú S.A. (TgP) from the Peruvian company Graña y Montero S.A.A.

Enagás Internacional, S.L.U. has reached an agreement to acquire the entire holding of the Peruvian company Graña y Montero S.A.A. in TgP (1.64%), for a total of 31.9 million dollars. The purchase is subject to the possible exercise of the right of first refusal by other shareholders.

Enagás in Peru

This agreement consolidates Enagás positioning in Peru as a strategic operator and reinforces its long-term commitment to the country. Enagás supports the development of projects that help to strengthen the security of energy supply in growing countries with stable regulatory frameworks, such as Peru, where it has been active since 2014.

In addition to TgP, Enagás also has interests in Compañía Operadora de Gas del Amazonas (Coga) and the Gasoducto Sur Peruano (GSP), for which it is the qualified operator.

In Latin America, Enagás is also active in Mexico and Chile, where it has stakes in the TLA Altamira (Mexico) and Quintero LNG (Chile) regasification plants. It also belongs to joint ventures that have been awarded two major gas infrastructure projects in Mexico, namely the Morelos pipeline and the Soto La Marina compressor station.



TgP

TgP, which commenced commercial operations in 2004, transports most of Peru's natural gas and condensates. It has a 729-km gas pipeline, which connects the Camisea gas fields with the Lurín city gate, and a 557-km polyduct that carries natural gas liquids from the Camiesa gas fields to the Pisco fractioning plant.

TgP is also currently investing in gas projects in Peru that are already being developed so as to increase its natural gas transmission capacity.

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
